THE ESSENCE OF FREE WILL



"Pregnancy of the 'Males' "



"Congratulations!" A Bollywood film made on the concept of a male getting pregnant. Seems impossible, right? But not in the case of a majestic marine creature, Seahorse (Hippocampus sp.). "Male seahorses get pregnant and give birth to baby seahorses." A very fascinating and astounding fact related to an animal living deep in the ocean. It is truly fascinating and the story seems to defy the laws of nature, but it is true that the natural adaptation and evolution let the males take part in the process of bearing offsprings. Seahorses, (Hippocampus sp.) majestic creatures of the oceans, belonging to the Class - Osteichthyes (Bony Fish), follow the mode of physiologically 'external' within a physically 'internal' fertilization. The females deposit unfertilized eggs inside the brood pouch, a special sac-like structure on the belly of the males, after a successful courtship. The male seahorse then fertilizes the eggs with sperm inside the brood pouch and nourishes them with nutrients, oxygen. After around 30 days, hundreds of baby seahorses come out from the belly of the father and live their individual lives.

Though it seems impossible for the most complex organisms on the earth, humans, laden with specialized organs and special hormones, it is not that difficult for the species of lower order. These kinds of fascinating facts of nature, magic of life intrigue our thoughts and keeps us curious.
