



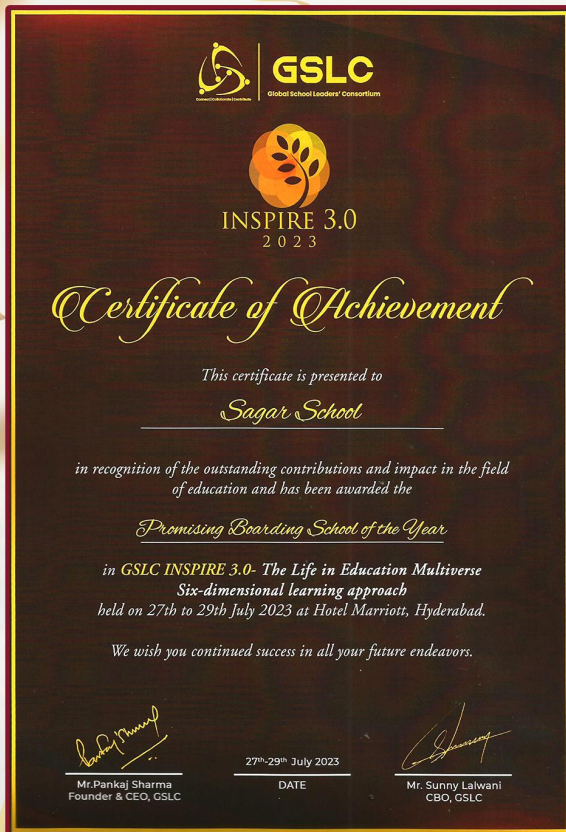

GLOBAL CONNECTION

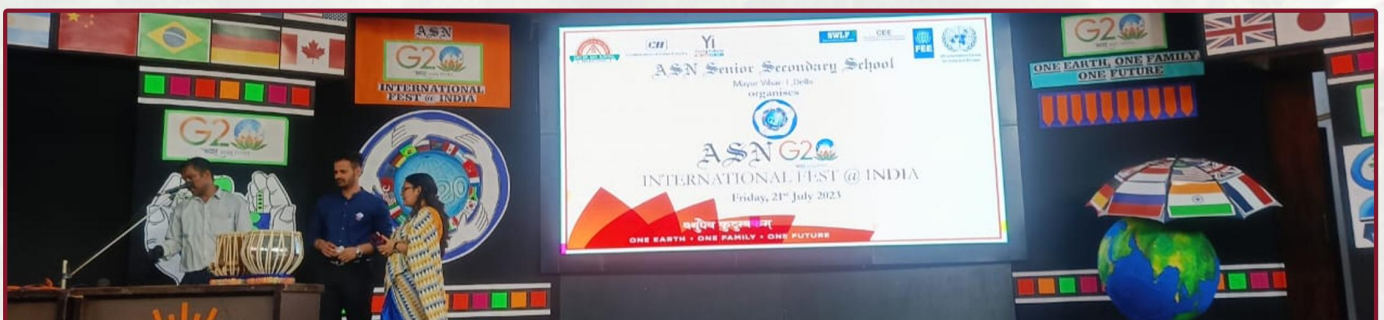

 Oh dear summer, hear my plea."

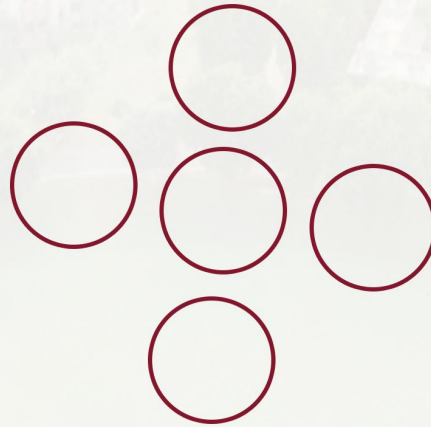
