WORLD STUDENTS' DAY



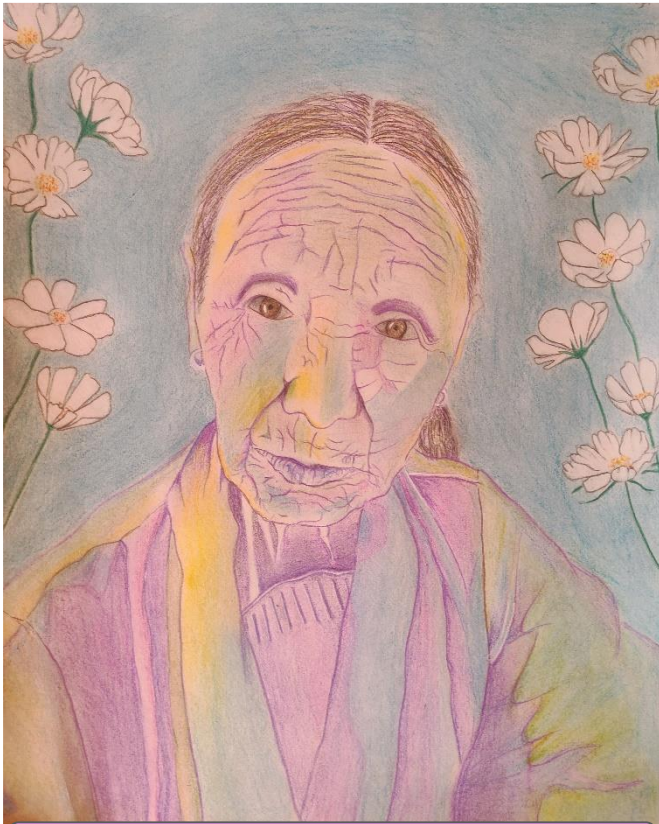

CREATIVE ENDEAVOURS

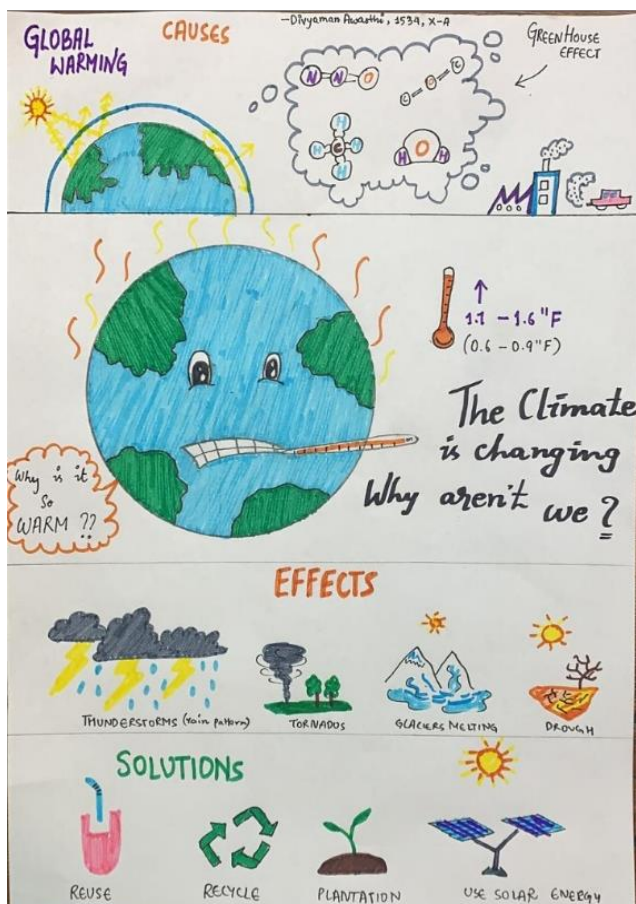


Gray Gaze – Tamchi Nyakum, XI
