Ms. Salony Priya, the Founder Director of Umeed who has worked 24 years in the field of counselling, education, consultancy and training for corporates, NGOs and social organisations, flagged off the ‘Responsible Sagarian Mission’ for the students of class XI and XII. It started off with understanding the difference between freedom and responsibility.



Adolescents often consider freedom and responsibility to be opposite sides of the coin. Throughout the session, intriguing questions and examples were redirected to the students for a better understanding on the matter.

This started with her telling the story of her son who wanted to watch a football match late at night. Since he stayed up the entire night, he couldn't wake up for the school next day.

He asked if he could skip school today as there was no special thing happening in school. She agreed, but later got to know there was a Math Quiz that day. She felt deeply disappointed even after him saying that he forgot about it and would be more careful next time. The next day, the son wanted to see the football match again. Would she allow once more?



This helped the students identify the true definition of freedom and responsibility. It is not the opposite side of the coin but in fact goes hand in hand. Internet safety, cyber bullying and gaming addiction were also some of the other topics she raised awareness about. The session proved to be quite thought-provoking, and the students were able to stop and look within themselves.

The questions were of various types – multiple choice to picture and video-based questions. The categories consisted of two rounds each with additional audience rounds in between.

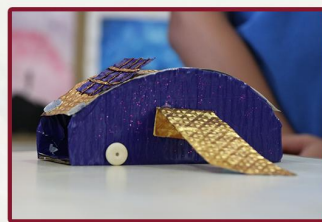
INTER-HOUSE CRAFT COMPETITION

SUNDAY ACTIVITIES

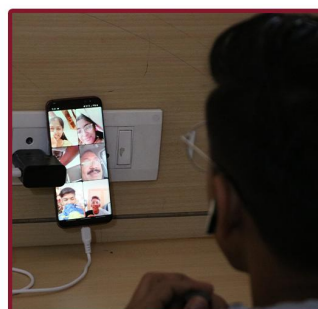

For the ones with the adrenaline rush, different sports activities are also held – swimming being the most popular; followed by playing basketball with friends, skateboarding and what not!



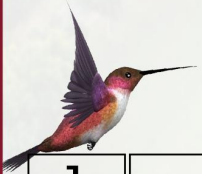
