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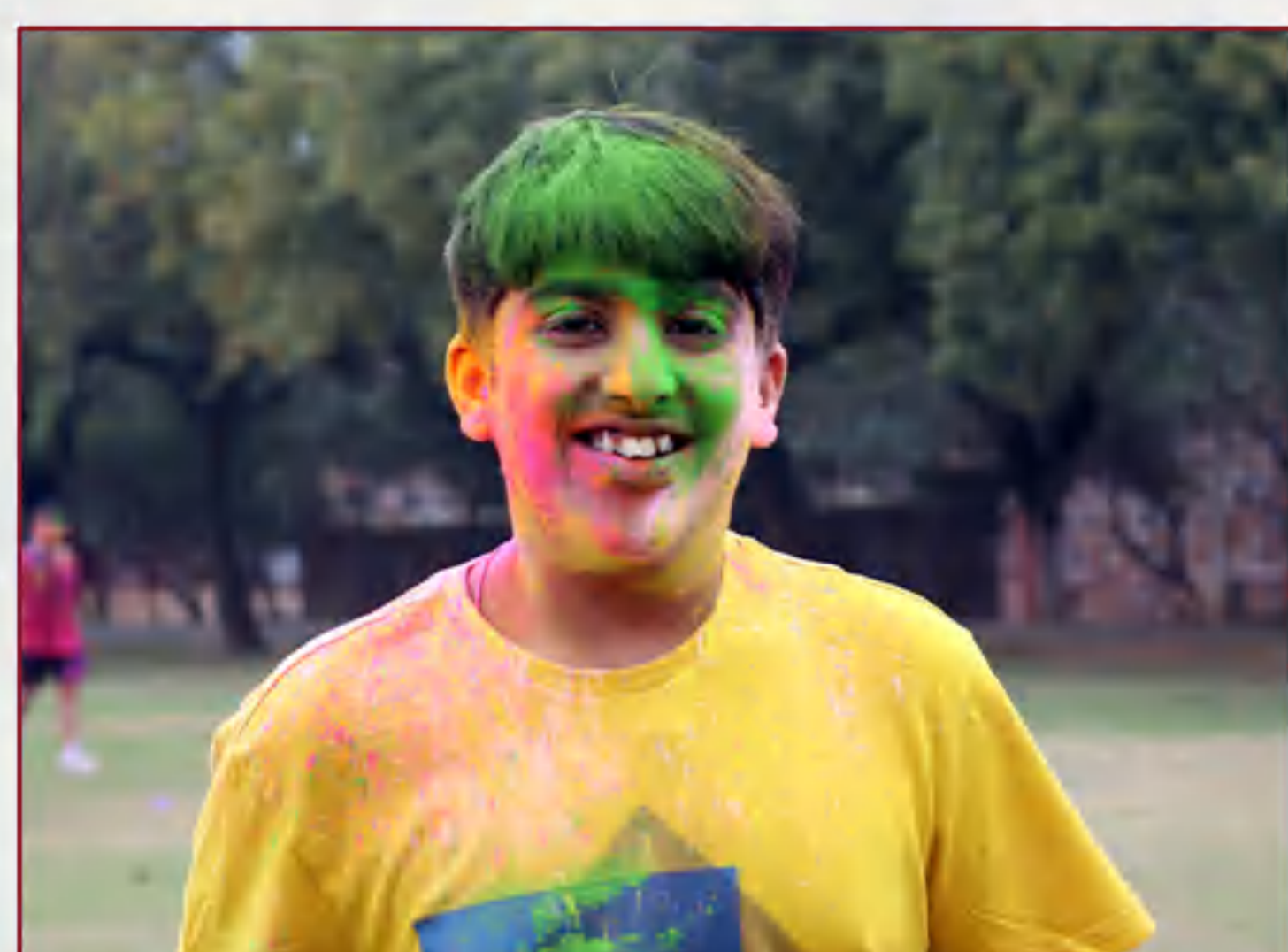
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GULAL AND GUJIA : THE HYMN OF HOLI

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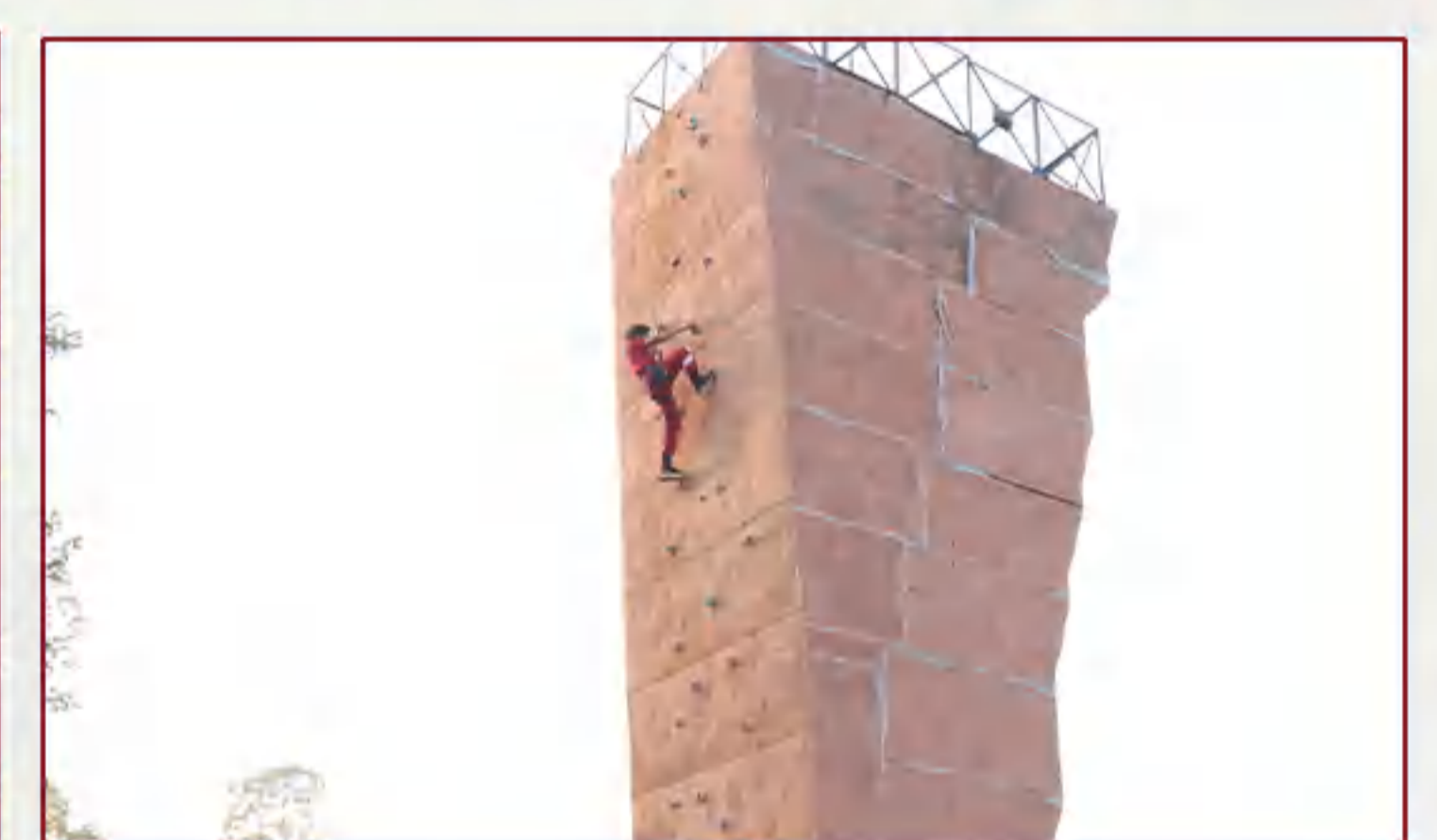
JUNOON LEADERSHIP CAMP & OUTDOOR IMMERSION PROGRAMME

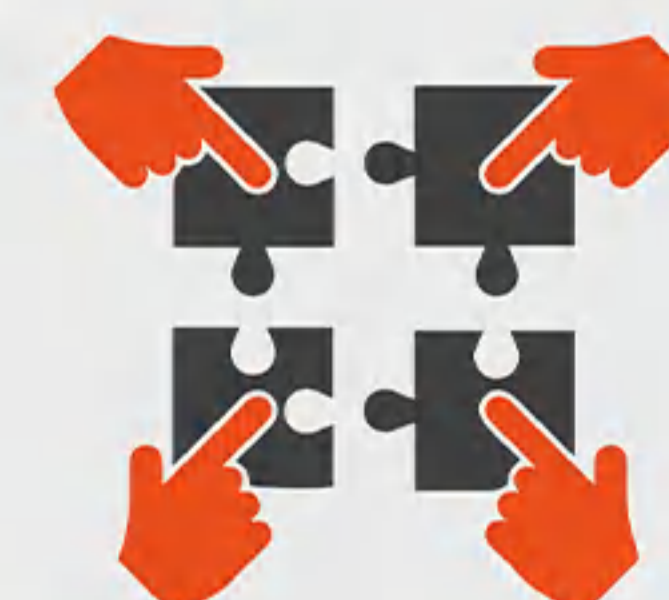
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
